## ***PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS***

Grace and peace to you!

We are coming to the end of the Season of Lent, and the fifty days of Easter will begin. Last month, I wrote about the colors and symbols used during the season of Lent, and this month, I am going to write about the days of Holy Week and Easter.

As I have said previously, Palm/Passion Sunday is very interesting for me because we begin the service by celebrating Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem and then shift to Jesus' suffering on the cross, all in one service. Our current Palm Sunday processions are gleaned from much larger and ancient liturgical processions. The early church in Jerusalem began the tradition by processing from the Mount of Olives into Jerusalem on the Sunday at the beginning of Holy Week. In the eleventh century, the procession became an official part of the Roman liturgy. The Church in Rome instituted the practice that led to the same day being known as the Sunday of the Passion: the reading of the Passion narrative. This is the only Sunday that is set aside for the complete reading of the passion narrative. We see the diversity of Christian liturgical traditions in this service. We process singing "Hosana" at the beginning of this service to hear about Christ's betrayal, arrest, torture, and death, and then we process to receive the meal that will hold us all together!

The name Maundy Thursday is derived from the Latin mandatum, meaning "command," referring to the foot-washing ceremony in the Gospel of John. In the gospel of John, Jesus spoke of the "new commandment" to love one another as he himself had loved. The Thursday in Holy Week is also the anniversary of the institution of the Lord's Supper, which was held the evening before Jesus' crucifixion. Maundy

Thursday developed as preparation for pascha. Pascha is the original Greek term for Easter. In the early church many disciplines related to Lenten preparation for Easter baptism concluded on the Thursday before Easter. The season of Lent involved many days of fasting, Maundy Thursday became the night on which the Lenten fast was broken during holy communion. The stripping of the altar and worship space unfolds in the Middle Ages as the practice of cleaning the space and changing the paraments.

The term Good Friday most likely came from "God's Friday," just as "good by" comes from "God be with ye." Friday in Holy Week is the anniversary of the crucifixion. This is the one day of the year that the church does not pray the great thanksgiving and celebrate holy communion. Holy communion is always a celebration of the resurrection of Christ. The lectionary appoints the reading of the passion from the Gospel of John on Good Friday. On the Sunday of the Passion, the passion narratives come from the gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke; John's passion is to be read only on Good Friday. Luther states: "John's Gospel is the one, fine, true, and chief gospel, and is far, far to be preferred over the other three and placed high above them." The intercessions on Good Friday trace back to the fifth century and extend fully to all of humanity and creation. The cross is carried in procession, and we, as worshipers, are encouraged to engage with it, which expresses confidence in the power of God!

On Easter Sunday, we celebrate Jesus overcoming death and the grave! The Easter season begins with the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night or at dawn on Easter Sunday) and ends fifty days later on Pentecost. Do you know how the date of Easter is selected? The day of Easter is observed on the first Sunday after the first full moon that occurs on or after the vernal equinox, which is March 21<sup>st</sup>, and was established by the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD. Easter Day can occur between March 22<sup>nd</sup> and April 25<sup>th</sup>. This method of dating Easter is to make sure it coincides with the feast of the Passover, since the first Easter took place during that feast. The Easter season lasts for fifty days, but we actually celebrate the resurrection of Christ every Sunday. The paschal candle is lit each Sunday during the fifty days, but on Easter day, it is lit before the assembly enters the worship space and is placed near the altar or the baptismal font. On Easter Sunday, we enact the message of salvation by joining to Christ and to one another in Holy Communion. Christ has risen from the dead!

Next month, we will continue looking at the different church seasons. As always, I continue to lift you up in prayer! If you have any pastoral care needs, please let me know.

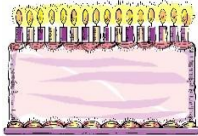
