From Our Pastor...

THE BIRTH OF JESUS: MATTHEW'S TAKE

As with you, the seasons of Advent and Christmas are a personal favorite. God taking on human flesh in the baby Jesus—Emmanuel, God with us. We are deeply moved upon hearing and singing the lyrics of our favorite Christmas hymns. “Hark! The herald angels sing, ‘Glory to the newborn king; peace on earth and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled.” And, “Away in a manger, no crib for a bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head; the stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay, the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.” Our joyful and hopeful expectations are filled with the images presented in these hymns, often borrowed from Luke’s version of the events of Jesus’ birth.

But in this liturgical year, beginning December 1st, the first Sunday of Advent, our attention is directed to Matthew’s depiction of Jesus’ birth and the surrounding events. I warn you: the tone is dark and somber. The narrative is replete with fear and potential shame and

embarrassment, deceptions and terror, and tragically the death of many innocents. Here I give you Matthew’s version. I would like you to imagine yourself being back there in that time and place, and reflect upon the feelings you might have had in witnessing these events. From Matthew:

“Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, ‘Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins. All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

‘Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel.’”

An unexpected and not easily explained pregnancy. What would their families have thought? What about the community’s reaction to what they might have believed to be upright and proper? How might have you responded—with acceptance and support or shame and embarrassment?

Matthew continues:

“In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, ‘Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.’ When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, ‘Bethlehem of Judea...’”

Fear on the part of the authorities. Does this indicate that power is (continued on page 2)

(continued) about to change hands? Has God had some part in issuing this possible change? Would any of this have any effect on your life or expectations? Would Herod's concerned fear impact your life? Could you have been implicated as party to these events? Would you have retreated and stayed silent, hoping that attention would not be drawn to you?

The wise men did reach their destination in Bethlehem, the house of Joseph and Mary, giving homage to the baby and presenting gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Matthew continues:

"And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road. Now after they left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.' Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, and remained there until the death of

Herod."

Having to flee your home with a new baby under the cover of darkness because of a threat upon his life by one who has a great deal of power in this world. How would you feel? Frightened? At wit's end? Would you have helped them in their escape plan? What if you were caught by Herod? Matthew continues:

"When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the wise men."

The death of innocent children. Maybe a relative's or neighbor's child. Despair and extreme sadness, not unlike that of Rachel. How would you deal with this pain and suffering? What questions would you ask? Where is God in all this? How or why did God let this happen? Can you feel Joseph's and Mary's anxiety as they escape to Egypt? Children still die today at the hands of those like Herod. What is or should be our response?

Joseph, Mary, and Jesus were able to return to the land of Israel, but not to their home but to a different territory because a descendent of Herod was still ruling over Judea. A new home, a new start. But does the danger ever cease? As Matthew notes, God takes God's place here in a world of fear and foreboding, danger and deceit.

As we settle into this year's Advent and Christmas, may we pause and reflect upon Matthew's story of Jesus' birth. How it has affected the world in which we live; how it has impacted our faith and perspective of the role of the church in addressing the misuse of power; how it challenges us to seek and honor the presence of Jesus in our time and place and to live in a way that truly reflects the way Jesus himself lived in a world of Herod's and Pilate's, of Peter's and Judas's.

All so that we might get to that time when all may join us in song, "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight."

Banquet Help Wanted

We will soon be serving banquets once again. What you may not be aware of is **'Help is always needed'**.

Help is needed in the dining room to serve the meals. We serve family style, so it is a matter of getting the dishes of food to each table. Once they have eaten, cake is served. Someone is needed to serve coffee at larger banquets as well. At smaller banquets, each server will cover their own tables. Servers are usually asked to arrive 45 minutes before serving time.

Help is needed in the kitchen as well. Some people are needed to come early, sometimes as early as 7:00 a.m. or 8:00 a.m. to start cooking the meat. Others are needed to come about 3 hours before serving time to cut meat. Several are needed about 2 hours before serving time to dish up the pickles, olives, and applesauce. About an hour before serving time, others are needed to dish up the foods that will be taken to the tables.

All are encouraged to stay for dishwashing and clean-up!

Everyone is welcome! Experience not necessary! Training provided!


