Grace and peace to you!

Many of you have heard that I am the new interim pastor of Messiah Lutheran Church in New Berlin. I just want to clear up any misunderstandings that you may have. I am only the interim pastor at Messiah. The following are my responsibilities that are outlined in the contract that I have with Messiah Lutheran Church and the Office of the Bishop:

- 1. Be diligent in prayer and reflection.
- 2. Review and approve the agenda for regular meetings of the Congregation Council.
- 3. Visit the ill or injured.
- 4. Officiate at funerals and weddings.
- 5. Preach and preside at Messiah Lutheran once a quarter.

At this time, Messiah Lutheran will not be joining the parish. Bishop Craig Miller has asked me to engage with Messiah Lutheran and the Buffalo Valley Lutheran Parish in a conversation about shared ministry. This conversation may, but not necessarily will, lead to Messiah Lutheran joining the parish. The three congregational councils consisting of First Evangelical Lutheran Church, Christ's United Lutheran Church, and Messiah Lutheran Church have met to begin these conversations. We will not rush into this process, but we will take some time to discern if this is what's best for the parish.
