## From Our Pastor...

### IF IT'S ABOUT JESUS, IT MUST ALSO BE ABOUT US

Our Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th. Lent is a 40 day period, excluding in the 40 day count the Sundays of Lent, in which the church is in preparation to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus on Easter Sunday. Historically, Lent was a time in which candidates for baptism were given instruction in the Christian faith, paying particular attention to Biblical readings and teachings and practices of the church, including the sacraments. Throughout the life of the church, the faithful engaged in various Lenten practices that focused on repentance, renewed commitment to the faith and a resourcefulness with a focus on regular worship and service to one another.

Lent is a focused reminder that God the Father has revealed and continues to reveal a path of righteousness, justice, salvation and peace in, through and by Jesus Christ for us and the world in which we inhabit. Lent is about what Jesus has done for us and continues to do, and it's about how we incorporate that belief in the way we live, in our thoughts and actions. Therefore our Lenten practices are to afford particularly close attention to a careful reading of holy scripture as we come to a faithful understanding of the manner in which the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ impacts and influences our lives as well

as enabling and empowering us to follow in his way.

During this season of Lent I want to encourage each and every one of us to get intimately reacquainted with the apostle Paul's majestic rendering of the gospel of Jesus Christ in his Epistle to the Romans, where he writes: "the gospel is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith...for in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith..." (Romans 1:16-17). Additionally, Paul indicates: "But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, the righteousness of God through the faith of Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as an atoning sacrifice by his blood, effective through faith" (Romans 3:21-25).

For each day in Lent I have provided a passage from Paul's Epistle to the Romans for us to ponder and reflect theologically upon as it bears upon our faith and the manner in which we live out our faith. Also, these passages from Romans will be the primary resources used in our Lenten Sunday worship services. As you pon-

der and reflect on these passages, I encourage you to share your thoughts in conversations with others as together we walk in faith.

Feb. 14 (Ash Wednesday – "God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us." Romans 5:8

Feb. 15 – "For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly." Romans 5:6

Feb. 16 – "Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God." Romans 5:9

Feb. 17 – "For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life." Romans 5:10

Feb. 18 – "It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification." Romans 4:24-25

Feb. 19 – "For if the many died through the one man's (Adam) trespass, much more surely have the grace of God and the free gift in the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, abounded for the many." Romans 5:15

Feb. 20 – "For the judgment

Feb. 22 – “Just as one man’s trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man’s act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all.” Romans 5:18

Feb. 23 – “For just as by the one man’s disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man’s obedience the many will be made righteous.” Romans 5:19

Feb. 24 – “Just as sin exercised dominion in death, so grace might also exercise do-

minion through justification leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.” Romans 5:21

Feb. 25 – “Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?” Romans 6:3

Feb. 26 – “Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the father, so we too might walk in newness of life.” Romans 6:4

Feb. 27 – “For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.” Romans 6:5

Feb. 28 – “We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin.” Romans 6:6-7

## Community Meals



**Property –** Jim Schwartz reported the window in the vestibule will be fixed. The kitchen frig has been repaired. Alarm system went off again for burglary alarm; false alarm. Coal stoker is fired and working. WELCA paid for the two new stoves in the kitchen. Complaint received about recycling bin and where it's located. Bin will be moved to basement level. Sexton is doing an excellent job and motivated. Condition of the frig in the social hall was discussed after the last repair. A new unit would cost approximately \$5000. Rishel Meats has closed the store and selling two similar units. Property will arrange to look at these units and then discuss how to proceed further. Harry reported that Richards have agreed to accept our initial offer allowing them to use the parsonage and receive a donation. Jeff Mensch will follow up with all the legalities relating to the usage of the parsonage.

Jim Schwartz nominated Barb Randecker for secretary; seconded by Gary Girton and passed unanimously.
