PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

Grace and peace to you!

First, I want to thank you all for the Christmas cards and gifts! I am truly blessed by you all!

Another "New Year" is upon us! And, it's time to eat pork and sauerkraut and make our New Year's resolutions! Many people think that Christmas is over and it's time to take down the decorations, but the Season of Christmas has just begun and lasts for twelve days, concluding when Epiphany arrives. What is Epiphany, you may be asking yourself. First, an epiphany is a sudden, profound realization, or one of those "aha" moments we've all encountered—that moment when we see reality and our lives a little differently. Epiphany for Christians is the feast day (January 6th) that marks the manifestation of Jesus and celebrates the visit of the Three Wise Men, or Magi, who brought gifts to Jesus.

In our Lutheran tradition, the season of Epiphany serves as a bridge between the birth of Jesus and his passion, as it draws together several themes: the birth of Jesus, the coming of the Magi, his baptism in the Jordan River, and his first miracle at the wedding in Cana in Galilee. Our current Lutheran calendar shows that the season of Epiphany extends to Ash Wednesday. It is our custom as Lutherans that the last Sunday of the Epiphany season is The Transfiguration of Our Lord, in which we remember a different epiphany that brings the Old Testament into Jesus' time.

During this time, the colors within the church change (in upcoming newsletters, I will be writing about the colors and symbols of the church and what they mean). The season starts as white, a continuation of the mood and spirit of Christmas. Some churches use gold instead of white on Epiphany, which symbolizes the kingly divinity of Christ to

whom the Magi offer their gifts. From the second Sunday after the Epiphany until the Transfiguration, the liturgical color is green. Green is often viewed as a time for growth. The color of the Transfiguration of Our Lord and the two days following is white. I hope this gives you a little understanding of Epiphany and why we do the things we do as Lutherans.

As you prepare to make your resolutions, take some time to reflect on what God has done in your life this year or maybe what you have learned from God. Take some time to pray. Pray for guidance, pray for those around you, and pray for the times when God blessed you.

One final note I would like to share with you this year. It was an amazing year both in the church and in my personal life. I give thanks to God for each and every one of you and for what you do for the church! As this year comes to a close, I want you to know that Andrea and I are now engaged! We ask that you pray for our families and us as we begin this new journey together! We will keep you all posted on the details of the wedding, and know that each of you will be a part of it!

May you have a happy and blessed New Year!

Contemporary Worship Services

Greetings Members of 4-Bells and First,



The Parish Council has been working to find ways of meeting two specific goals for both of our churches: provide for more opportunities to worship together, and grow our memberships. With Pastor Curt's help, we have developed an idea that we would like to try next year that may address both of these goals.

Pastor Curt has spoken with many people throughout the past year – especially younger people – asking them what would attract them to our churches. One theme that came up over and over was the addition of a contemporary service with contemporary music. The Pastor approached the Parish Council asking for its approval to develop such a service and try it one Sunday each month next year (probably starting in February) and develop it throughout the year. We will revisit it at the end of the year to decide if we should continue, as well as any changes to be made. Pastor Curt's friend – Ms. Andrea Mayeski – has graciously agreed to lead these services as a volunteer. Andrea has a degree in music and has experience leading contemporary services.

The Parish Council presented this idea to both individual church councils for their input before making a decision and both councils supported implementing it next year. The Parish Council formally approved the idea and directed the Worship and Music Committee to work with Pastor and Andrea to develop and implement the service.

This service will be a joint service on the last Sunday of each month at 10:00 and will alternate between Four Bells and First. Reminders will be put in church bulletins and the newsletter. There was an initial concern that this meant members of First would have two services every other month away from First (the second Sunday at UCC and the last Sunday at 4-Bells). However, we were recently informed by UCC that they would not be continuing their joint service with First on the second Sunday, so this is no longer an issue.

Again, it will take time to develop this contemporary service so the goal is to hold the first one at the end of February, but it is possible that March may be more realistic. If any member of either church would like to provide input or get involved in this service, please see any council member or the Pastor.

Thank you all for your support as we try to grow our churches!!!

**THE REV. EMIL ENGLEMAN**  
**June 19, 1932 - November 4, 2025**

The Rev. Emil J. Engelman, 93, of Dallastown passed away peacefully surrounded by his family on November 4th at 9:14 p.m. Emil was ordained as a Lutheran minister June 30, 1963 at First Lutheran Church Altoona, PA, after graduating from Gettysburg College with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1960, and from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg with a master of divinity degree in 1963. He served as a student pastor during 1961 at Karthaus, Keewaydin and Oak Hill, Clearfield County, and during 1962 at Lily and Gallitzin, Cambria County. After ordination he served the Harleton Charge comprised of Laurelton, Swengel, Rays, and Harleton churches. During his pastorate the four churches merged, built a new church, education unit and fellowship hall. Rev. Engelman served the new church – Christ United or “The Four Bells Church” – until late 1967. He then served Fourth Lutheran Church, Altoona, PA from 1967 to 1980. A new church complex was constructed under his leadership and dedicated in 1971. He was called to Christ Lutheran Church, Dallastown, PA in October 1980 and served there until his retirement on Christmas Day 1999.



Throughout his calling Emil was on the Board and First Treasurer of Camp Mt. Luther, served as Chaplain of the VA hospital in Altoona, was a member of the Synodical Committee for the deaf, Synodical Evangelism Committee and chairman of the Parish Life Committee. He also served on the Spiritual Renewal Committee, was a delegate to the churchwide conversations in Dallas, Milwaukie, and Seattle, and a member of the Board of Directors of Lutheran Social Services, South Region for nine years. Rev. Engelman also served as a Board Member of the Shrewsbury Village and Strausburg Haus.

Emil was born in Altoona, PA June 19, 1932, the son of the late Emil and Geraldine (Burket) Engelman. He married his high school sweetheart Nancy (Barr) Engelman in February 1953 and had seventy wonderful years of marriage up until her death in February 2024.

He is survived by his two daughters, Cynthia Howard (Ed) of Altoona and Alyn Nedimyer (Leo) of Lugoff, SC, and his two sons, Dr. Emil Eric Engelman (Robyn) of Dorr, MI and Hans K. Engelman (Karen) of Red Lion, PA, twelve grandchildren and nine great grandchildren, one brother Melvin Engelman of Altoona, and five sisters; Delores Patz, Jennifer Miller, Deborah Engelman all of Altoona, Darlene Emigh of Roaring Springs, PA and Joan Gorman of Lancaster, PA. He was preceded in death by a brother Leo Engelman of Altoona.

A time to share memories and an opportunity to view will be held November 10th from 6-8 PM at the Austin H. Eberly Funeral Home, Inc., 104 W. Main St., Dallastown. An additional viewing and a time to celebrate his life will be held on November 11th from 10-11 AM at Christ Lutheran Church, 126 W. Main St., Dallastown followed by an 11:00 AM service officiated by Pastor Patti Bream and Pastor Paul Frank. Internment will be at Blymire Cemetery, Dallastown.
