From Our Pastor...

A BLESSED LIFE (Ephesians 1:3-14)

Both in retrospection and in wishful longing, many talk about having had, having or wanting the “good” life. Indicators of the “good” life have often varied through the ages, conditioned as well by cultural values and norms. In our time and place, the “good” life is often defined in terms of degrees of success, usually with respect to comforts, power, prestige, prosperity or status. Indicators allowing for a measurement of this “good” life have included physical and cognitive abilities, material possessions, capital and societal ranking and influence. A successful foray into the “good” life is said to bring about a “peace of mind,” producing high levels of happiness and pleasure as well as keeping to a minimum the effects of stress and pain.

Regardless of our abilities and ambitions, and the demands and wants placed upon us in our time and place, there are no guarantees that anyone’s “good” life will bear the marks of perpetuity or immorality. One can and does “fall,” at times quickly, from the “good” life through one’s own faults and failures from choices acted upon as well as missed opportunities or, more often than not, simply by those external factors and the “accidents” of natural occurrences which impact and exacerbate the many limitations imposed upon our bodies and minds and well-being.

Because the pursuit and hoped-for attainment of the “good” life

is often affected by and influenced by factors and occurrences beyond our control, what then are we to trust and where do we place our hope? The apostle Paul addressed this very question in his letter to the Ephesians for a people whose lives and interests were not so much unlike our own. Majestically, Paul used the language of what was then perceived as the normal way to depict the “good” life in his day (riches, wisdom, pleasure, inheritance, power, status) and reframed and reformulated it to now characterize the “blessed” life that all are able to receive according to the foundational (before there was even a time or place to pursue the “good” life) will of God the Father through the redemptive gift of Christ Jesus. This “blessed” life can only be received by and through the immeasurable and boundless grace provided as Christ shall gather all in heaven and on earth in the fullness of time.

Whereas it was and is often thought that the “good” life was to be pursued through and by human ambition, motivation and effort, and could also be necessarily affected by external natural and societal courses, and therefore subject to gain and loss, the “blessed” life that Paul refers to is but a gift of grace simply and solely received in trust and hope. Whereas the “good” life could always be affected and influenced by the factors of personal choices, preferences and effort as well as external oc-

currences, natural and/or social, the “blessed” life is a predestined and external gift from God’s actions in and through Christ and, therefore, not subject to the whims of human thought or behavior. This is “GOOD NEWS”/ Gospel for ALL, and not just for those who have attained or hope to attain the “good” life.

In Paul’s day, suggestions of the “good” life often depend greatly on one’s nationality, gender, status or wealth, that is, whether one was Jew or gentile, man or woman, master or slave, rich or poor. These categories of differentiation and division that functioned, even as they still do in many places today, to determine the “good” life were erased, according to Paul in his opening statement in Ephesians, by the mystery of God’s good pleasure and eternal will, planned and given purpose before the foundation of the world; that is, before anyone was able to say or achieve anything, be it good or bad. Therefore, the grace of God at work in the redemptive and forgiving way of Christ brings all, in heaven and on earth, to a state of “blessedness” (1:3, 10). In and because of God’s grace, the pursuit of the “good” life has given way to the gift of a “blessed” life, where the drive for success gives way of peace for all by and in God’s grace.

Our collective “blessed” life is neither initiated nor attained

by us through our attitudes and behaviors, ambitions and wants, motivations and desires. Unlike the "good" life, a "blessed" life cannot be achieved or awarded by being "good" at something, such as growing crops, baking pies, singing songs, hammering nails, repairing cars, caring for children, hitting baseballs, or preaching sermons. These abilities and actions are. Indeed, "good," for they help build and sustain caring, supportive and productive communities at many levels of work and play, but in no way do they merit special favors from the God of

grace. We are "blessed" simply because God, mysterious as it may be to us, thought it was a "good" idea to give blessing to us before the world was even formed. This gift of a "blessed" life rests entirely upon the gift of God's grace shared by and through the faithfulness of Christ Jesus. A "blessed" life does not adhere to nor is regulated by the ups and downs of human performance and preference but is drawn down to and from the power and authority of God's grace which, in Christ, gathers together all in heaven and on earth according to God's


good pleasure.

The "good" in our lives, whether thoughts, actions or deeds, is intended by God to be a thankful response to the gift of our "blessing" at the hands of God's grace received in, through and by Christ. Our "goodness," therefore, is but an attribute of our being "blessed" by God, and a call to reach out and share the fruits of our "blessing" with all because God's "blessing" through Christ includes all.

Secretary's Report: April minutes were submitted and approved as read.

Treasurer's Report: April reports submitted and approved subject to audit.

Pastor's report: Pr. John reported that within the congregation that we will have a memorial service for Jean Sanden on May 19. Several parish wide activities approaching. In June we will have parish picnic and worship in the park. Last Sunday was conference meeting at Zion Lutheran. Serious issues we are facing include pastoral care; lacking pastors and congregation giving. ELCA as a whole will be facing this issues as well in the upcoming years. Pr. John will be attending family services conference and at the Lutheran Day at the capital in Harrisburg.

Communication: Harry Boyer received a thank you from USS synod for meeting our 2017 benevolence goals.

Property – Jim Schwartz reported that he received a call from the painter. He will be here towards the end of May. Last night during property committee meeting the members went around turned all the thermostats down. The furnace room was not locked. When they got here this evening the door was locked and heat was turned all the way up. Not sure how any of that happened. Wooden edges to sidewalks along parking lot will be replaced.

Christian Education –no report

Fellowship & Recreation – no report

Service & Outreach – Libby Loss reported that her and Libby Loss will sponsor a Volunteer Sunday will be on May 20th. 15 groups from the congregation will have information available to everyone in the congregation about their groups.

Finance – Committee met last week to review where we stood budget wise which is mostly inline at this point and to discuss the deficit. WELCA transferred \$7000 to the General Fund which was a huge help. Different ways were discussed to make the congregation more aware of our situation. Financial information will be published again in both the weekly bulletin and the monthly newsletter. Spending will be kept to a minimum.

Youth – Gary Girton reported that Kim is looking for volunteers for workcamp. Youth Sunday is May 13th.

Staff Support – no report

Parish Council: Council was scheduled for April 30 but there was not a quorum. Discussed the June service in the park and the possibility of having a end of summer worship at Hidden Valley Campground. Next meeting is scheduled for July 9th.

Business:

Synod Assembly: Harry Boyer will go on Saturday only with Jane Moore.

Sexton: Received letter of resignation from Paul Houtz effective May 11th. Before the next employee is hired the job description needs updated to include small repairs. Jeff Mensch made motion to accept resignation; seconded by Jim Schwartz and passed unanimously. There is a person interested in the position. Staff support and property will follow up. Jeff Mensch made a motion that whoever staff support and property recommends they will be paid \$15 per hour with a revised job description; seconded by Jane Moore and passed unanimously.

Mechanical Engineer for Heating system: Jim Schwartz reported that they met with Silvertip to get a mechanical engineer to evaluate our heating system. Received a quote for \$2300 to received a detailed evaluation. Property committee reviewed it last night and recommends we proceed. There is money in G&E in capital improvement funds to finance this. Motion made by Jeff Mensch to accept property's recommendation and use G&E funds to proceed with evaluation; seconded by Linda Skinner and passed unanimously.

Door Locking Systems: Cher Girton reported that she had Phil from A-1 come and look at system to see why doors aren't unlocking at all times. He reviewed the locks and said new locks would be approximately \$750 to replace. We agreed to let it go for now.

Meeting closed with prayer by Harry Boyer and adjourned @ 1816 .
