From Our Pastor...

LOVE ENTERS NEW TERRITORY

Another season of Lent is upon us. This forty-day journey leads the faithful to again experience Easter and the promise of the resurrection with the fullness of joy and hope. The journey we call Lent prepares the faithful to fully trust God's will and promise for us as revealed in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Lent was originally a time set aside to instruct and prepare candidates for baptism at the Easter Vigil. Its intent was to enable the faithful to experience the presence of the Risen Jesus and to receive the power of the Holy Spirit as participants within the body of Christ, the church.

The Lenten mood is to be sincere and sober, reverent and respectful - before God and with the faithful. Lenten preparations lead the faithful in ways of prayer, study, personal and communal reflection on God's Word, and service to any in need. Lent is not and was never intended to be a forty-day prelude to Good Friday whereby the faithful are put in a place of mourning, fear and guilt in the shadows of the cross. Sure, Lenten reflections and practices acknowledge human sin but the primary focus is to be on the way in which God's will and love have been and continue to be revealed in the presence of Christ

Lent is a faith practice that opens the eyes of the faithful to the immeasurable magnitude of God's love poured into our world through Jesus. This love is incalculable to the ways of obligations and payments, to the imaginations of what is to be deserved or owed. Lent the faithful of transcendent, limitless and unconditional love lived through and experienced by Jesus. This same love is now available to us by the power present to us through the Spirit of the Risen Christ. God's love overcomes any and all sin. God's love reaches further than the consequences of our idolatrous choices. God's love eternally casts out the darkness of evil, even the kind that wishes the death of

another.

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son..." This passage from John 3:16 suggests that God wills to give His love to each and to all through the eternal presence of Jesus. God's love is fully represented in every aspect of Jesus' life and presence in our world- in His birth, in His teaching and healing, in His dying and death, and in His resurrection. Throughout John's Gospel, God's love is to be found wherever Jesus is, even as He hangs on the cross. The cross stands not as a witness to the absence of God's love but to the extent God is willing to express His love against any and all forces that would seek solutions to life's problems by death. "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but so that the world might be saved through Him." (John 3:17)

Therefore, the faithful may see and understand Lent as an intentional opportunity before Easter to experience through prayer, study, reflection and service the manner by which God's Love Enters New Territories in our lives personally and in relationship with others of God's creation. The journey of Lent is a guide to help us see and live by the way of God's love revealed fully in the life, the death and the resurrection of Jesus. God's love is able to be learned by us as we bear witness to the ways Jesus fully lived God's love through His teachings, His relationships, and even in His death. We come to know this love of God as eternal (unlimited) through the resurrection of Jesus whose presence continues to bear upon us the full weight of God's love in the here and now.

The practice of Lent reminds us that God's love for us (and the world) is unconditional (not caused or motivated by our actions, good or bad) and that our love for one another is not to be based merely on reciprocity (do unto others as you would have them do to you) but only on the example of Jesus' love for us- "love one another as I love you" (John 13: 34). The practice of Lent provides two essential warnings to the

faithful. First, be constantly aware of any and all attempts to try to place conditions on the giving or receiving of God's love- that we can either earn or lose God's love by what we say (or not) and do (or not).

God loves, not as a reaction to the human condition, but in order to birth and keep humanity in an eternal relationship with God, in spite of all human opposition. Second, be alert to any and all traps that would find excuses for not loving others. Jesus did not stop loving others even in the face of betrayal, rejection and persecution. When He calls upon us to love as He loves, one can no longer find any valid reason to ignore or exclude others from receiving our love- not their indifferences, not their contrary beliefs, not their hateful thoughts or actions, not even their attempts to bring our witness of Jesus to an end.

As we proceed through Lent, may we be thoughtful of our sins, shortcomings, failures and weaknesses. But more importantly, may we remember, reflect, recall and receive the fullness of God's love given to us in and through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, the Lord of our present and the Savior of our eternal relationship with our Creator. No greater love can there be than God's love for us. No greater example can be found than the way Jesus lived and died for us- "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:12).

May the love of God enter anew the territories of our families, churches, and communities that our worship of God and our service to one another may be filled and guided by the way Jesus lived and lives for us by the way of unconditional and nonjudgmental love. And may our Lenten preparations provide ways to practice our faith and share the love of God with all in Jesus' name. "Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid" (John 14:27). Rest upon these words of Jesus to the Father, "I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me" (John 17:23).
