We have been angry with God for letting these things happen. But you have faithfully rallied together to pray for each other and to be there to support each other. You have had a pastor that has listened to you and prayed with and for you, but who pastors the pastor? It may seem like an odd question, but it's a real and serious question. Who do I get to fall back on when I face these same questions that you face? Who do I look upon when I am angry with God? Like some of you, I have been angry with God during this season of ministry. Wondering why me? Why my community again? Why my congregations?

So, let me tell you who I have leaned on. I have had a couple of close friends and church members (not going to mention any names, but you know who you are) who have listened and been there for me. Unexpectedly, some of the best help for me was a group of grieving fourth graders! I spent two afternoons at the Mifflinburg Intermediate School helping a group of kids process the loss of a close friend and to try and put a smile on their faces. But, in the midst of their pain, they were able to pull me out of a dark hole that I had been in for a while, and they were able to put a smile on my face! In our grieving and our hearts and minds filled with all kinds of emotions, we were able to help each other out! God

sent me to a group of kids to help, but God worked through those kids to help a grieving pastor. I am forever grateful for that group of kids, and I will continue to pray for them and be there for them when they need it!

#### WHAT TO TAKE TO BED WITH YOU

(not a joke)

Put your car keys beside your bed at night.

Tell your spouse, your children, your neighbors, your parents, your doctors' office, the check-out girl at the market, everyone you run across. Put your car keys beside your bed at night.

If you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get in your house, just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off, and the horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off or the car battery dies.

This tip came from a neighborhood watch coordinator. Next time you come home for the night and you start to put your keys away, think of this: It's a security alarm system that you probably already have and requires no installation. Test it. It will go off from most everywhere inside your house and will keep honking until your battery runs down or until you reset it with the button on the key fob chain. It works if you park in your driveway or garage.

If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break into your house, odds are the intruder won't stick around. After a few seconds, all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see who is out there and sure enough the criminal won't want that. And remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can work the same way there. This is something that should really be shared with everyone. Maybe it could save a life or a sexual abuse crime.

P.S. I am sending this to everyone I know because I think it is fantastic. Would also be useful for any emergency, such as a heart attack, where you can't reach a phone. My Mom has suggested to my Dad that he carry his car keys with him in case he falls outside and she doesn't hear him.... He can activate the car alarm and then she'll know there's a problem.

Please pass this on even IF you've read it before. It's a reminder.




