October 8 Congregational Meeting Minutes

A special congregational meeting of Christ's United Lutheran Church was held on Sunday, October 8, 2023 following the 8:30 a.m. worship service. Church Council President Jennifer Keister called the meeting to order.

As mentioned in a prior mailed letter and announcements at the beginning of two prior Sunday worship services, Council received a bid of \$11,900.00 from Nu-Look Driveway Sealing to seal parking lot cracks, reseal the parking lot, and paint the parking stall lines. Teresa Shuck moved that the congregation accept Nu-Look Driveway Sealing's bid, as described above, and seconded by Idella Zimmerman. After a brief discussion, the motion passed by voice vote.

Also mentioned in advance via mailed letter and worship service announcements, Christ's United Worship & Music Committee met and recommended to our Council that we hold communion at the communion rail during Sunday worship once a month. Council decided to receive congregation input by placing this to a vote. When asked which Sunday of the month, Pastor Curt responded that if approved it would be on the first Sunday of the month and would start in November. Glenn Spangler moved to resume communion at the communion rail once a month. Seconded by Linda Smith and the motion passed via voice vote.

<u>NOTE!</u> The work on the parking lot was completed October 11-13 by Nu-Look Driveway Sealing.

Beginning November 5 and continuing the first Sunday of subsequent months, we will be communing at the rail.


#### Pot Pie Sale


