HOPE'S HAVEN FOOD PANTRY MINISTRY

What Is It, How Does It Work?

Hope's Haven Food Pantry exists to offer assistance for families residing in Union County who have food insecurity. Currently in Union County the food insecurity rate is 8.9% of the population, or approximately 3,800 people. This amounts to an annual food budget shortfall of \$2,488,000.

At Hope's Haven, to receive food, families must show proof of address, supply names and birthdates of all persons in their household and certify that their total family income is below the TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program) limit (currently 185% of the poverty level). For example, currently the total income of a family of 2 must not exceed \$3,040 monthly.



Hope's Haven also is the Western Union County site for the Senior Box Program. This is an additional monthly box of food available to each person 60+ years of age who meets the income limits of the program. This is currently set at 130% of the poverty level. For example, currently the total income of a family of 2 must not exceed \$2,137 monthly.



Hope's Haven currently operates on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month and serves nearly 100 families each week. We have approximately 18 volunteers who do such things as pick up items from donors, weigh and sort items, unload trucks, pack boxes for clients and assist with the distributions. A good number of our volunteers are not CULC members.

While Hope's Haven is a ministry of Christ's United, all money spent for food and equipment is from donations from persons in the community, with less than 10% of donations coming from members of Christ's United. We also have 2 turkey dinners each year as a fundraiser and occasionally receive grant money. We recently had money available for equipment and purchased 12 – 18 qt roasters for Christ's United.

Since Hope's Haven is a ministry of Christ's United, we currently have several storage rooms available for food storage and the use of the fellowship hall for distributions.

If anyone has any questions or concerns, please feel free to stop by on a distribution day to observe, or better yet, volunteer.


