Grace and peace to you!

"⁸ But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" ⁹ For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; ¹⁰ and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." ¹¹ When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him."—Luke 5:8-11

This is part of the gospel for this Sunday, and we see Jesus beginning to call the disciples. I wonder what it would have been like for the disciples to leave everything behind and follow Jesus. They put their careers on hold, leaving families behind to follow a stranger. Jesus tells Simon that he will be catching people, not fish. Jesus also reminds Simon, "Do not be afraid," we hear that repeatedly throughout the Bible. Being a disciple of Christ is not easy; it's hard, really, really, hard! We don't have to leave our careers and families behind to follow Jesus, but we have to leave behind our old ways. We have to leave behind our old ways of living, our old ways of thinking, and our old ways of treating each other. We are called to repent, which is turning away from our sins and seeking a renewed life and relationship with God. All of this can be scary, but that's why we are constantly reminded, "Do not be afraid!" God is always with us on this journey to guide and direct us, love and care for us!

To be a disciple of Christ and to live as the body of Christ takes some risks! Are you willing to take some risks this year? I want you to commit to attending worship more often. I want you to commit to attending Bible study. I know many of you have hectic lives, and some have kids involved in different activities. However, make it a priority to read the Word together, pray together as a family, and commit to attending worship at

least once a month as a family. I want you to commit to putting your differences aside and working together in ministry. We don't always agree with each other, but we have to put our differences aside to grow as the body of Christ! Our parish has some great ministries, and we must commit to supporting them. Take a risk, prioritize, commit, and watch your faith grow and the body of Christ grow!

Know that I am always praying for you! If you have any pastoral care needs, please let me know!
