PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

Grace and peace to you!

The season of Lent has begun. On Ash Wednesday, ashes were placed in the form of a cross on our foreheads. That cross connects us with both Good Friday and Easter morning, and we are reminded of the promise that as we have risen from dust to this life, and so with Christ, we will rise from the dust of death to eternal life. We have entered these long 40 days, 40 long days to be reminded to repent. Our hymns tend to be mournful and a little gloomy and we refrain from using "alleluia" until Easter morning. But if we look at some of our upcoming readings and we pay attention, really pay attention, to what we are hearing, there is actually more light than darkness. A lot more grace poured out on us than there is punishment.

At the beginning of Lent, we are reminded that we are not alone. God has not abandoned us. We hear in an upcoming Psalm that even when we are focused only on ourselves to the point of sin, God is always with us, ready to bring us out of the dark and back to the light. Part of this Lenten journey that we are on is to repent and return. We are to return to our risen Lord. Repent means to change the direction in which we are looking to move, and to look and to move in a new direction. Just think of all the possibilities that we have as a parish if we change the direction in which we are looking to move and actually move in that direction. Think of the outreach ministries that we can do in our communities or how many people we can reach if we actually just change the direction in which we are looking and move in that direction!

There is a lot to be joyful about in Lent. After all, Paul tells us, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." This Lenten season remember that you are dust and rejoice because God is always with you!

Know that I am always praying for you! If you have any pastoral care needs, please let me know!


Chicken Barbecue

Synod congregations will join to celebrate the annual "Camp Mount Luther Sunday" on March 2, 2025, Transfiguration Sunday. The Upper Susquehanna Synod Council designated that day to be "Camp Mount Luther Sunday" to help promote outdoor ministries in the synod. Congregations will uplift the ministries of the camp during their worship services that day.

Camp Mount Luther is an extension of the ministry that is done in local congregations. The camp is asking that congregations promote the camp on that Sunday or designate another Sunday this spring to do so. special camp music during Sunday school and church services as well as special offerings being collected. These activities are all expected to be done during worship services across the synod.
