Grace and peace to you!

"29 But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." So he went in to stay with them. 30 When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. 31 Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. 32 They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" 33 That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. 34 They were saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!" 35 Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread."—Luke 24:29-35

Again, we are challenged to use our senses! Again, Jesus' followers don't recognize him! What roads have you traveled and not recognized Jesus? There have been times in my life that I have not always recognized Jesus. There have been many times in my life where I have questioned God. I remember in the comic strip Hagar the Horrible, Hagar stood on a rock in a violent storm as his ship sank, lashed by thunder and lightning. Hagar shouts to God, "Why me?" And God responds, "Why not?" Many times, I have felt like Hagar; why me God? Why are all these things happening to me? But with those questions, my faith has deepened because God has remained faithful and not given up on me! No matter how many times we question things or want to walk way, God always loves us and never gives up on us!

Was it the breaking of the bread during communion that you recognized Jesus? Maybe a meal shared with family and friends made you recognize Jesus? The days following

the death and resurrection were difficult for those early followers, and their world was turned upside down. Honestly, I think we can say the same thing today. Our lives have been turned upside down. Some of you may be facing job uncertainties or where your next meal will come from. When you are in those dark and uncertain times, I continue to ask you to look for Jesus. It is always in those unexpected places that we see him! Know that Jesus is traveling with you on this road! Know that Jesus cares for you and loves you!

As always, I continue to lift you up in prayer! If you have any pastoral care needs, please let me know.



### PENTECOST JUNE 7



The two most common Pentecost symbols represent the Holy Spirit. A descending dove is frequently used to symbolize the coming of the Spirit, since the Gospel of Luke reports that the Holy Spirit came to Jesus at his baptism in the form of a dove. (Luke 3:22). Tongues of fire are also used to symbolize the Holy Spirit, based on the account of Pentecost found in Acts 2:1-4. The liturgical color for the Day of Pentecost is bright red, which reminds us of the fire of the Spirit.

Bright red is also the color of the geraniums we use to decorate the sanctuary on Pentecost. If you would like to donate some geraniums for this purpose (the plants will then be planted around the church), please fill out the form below and return it to Janice Wagner or Margie.
