Grace and peace to you,

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens:

I often struggle with what to write about in the newsletter, and this month was no exception. This month, I had a little help though (more about that in a bit). The first eight verses of this text are often used at funerals, and it's a beautiful passage that describes different seasons in our lives, which is

God does it so that people will fear him. <sup>15</sup> Whatever is has already been, and what will be has been before; and God will call the past to account."—Ecclesiastes 3:1-15

why I think it's used at funerals. We often find ourselves in different seasons of our lives, and as a church, we find ourselves in other seasons as well. I see that our ministry is in a different season, perhaps a little stagnant and not as clear. I have been trying to brainstorm various ideas to help us transition into a new season as a parish. I am excited about a couple of possibilities for us that I will be presenting to the parish council at our next meeting. So, you will have to wait a little longer to see what is in store for us!

I have also been going through different seasons in my personal life. I am in the process of purchasing a house, and hopefully, I will be moving to New Berlin very soon! I have been able to spend some much-needed time with my boys going to Yellowstone and attending some Penn State sporting events. For a while now, you have seen some new faces during our worship services, and many of you have had the opportunity to meet and chat with Andrea and her children. Andrea has commented numerous times on how nice you have been to her and how you have all made her feel so welcome in the parish. I am truly grateful and blessed that you have made her feel that way! So, the rest of this piece will be Andrea talking about "when seasons change." Enjoy!

When God puts the pieces together, you find that certain seasons in life were meant to be. For the next couple of weeks, we will see some bright colors because the leaves will be changing. Even though it gets colder, Fall is my favorite time of the year. In life, we are constantly changing. As we see in this text, the only constant in life is change. We go through ups and downs. We have good and bad seasons in life. Seasons come in a variety of ways.

As Solomon wrote, "there is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." Examining this phrase, we understand that seasons are timed and set in motion specifically. Our natural and spiritual lives are set in motion and timed out. God promises that His timing of the day and seasons shall not end. He has set the universe in motion to precise function so that we can notice when the seasons change. How are the seasons calculated? Our seasons can be calculated to the exact minute. That's the kind of God we serve. He has timing for the beginning and the end of time. He has calculated a time for you and your season in life. He calculated when and where we are born. What we experience in life is calculated. God has a purpose and plan for us. God has a plan, even if it appears in the wrong way. One of the things that stands out to us regarding

our season in life is our calling. We pray about what God wants us to do. We all have specific gifts and talents that God has given us. When we sense God's calling, we find our gifts come to life and we use them for his purposes.

Ecc. 3:11 "He has made everything beautiful in its own time." Each season is different, but beautiful in its own way. We are different yet beautiful in our own way. God is a mysterious God. We see and observe things we don't understand. Why do certain things happen a certain way? There are plenty of things we look back on and wonder why something happened the way it did. It may not make sense, but God will show you why certain seasons in life were meant to be. He was guiding us the entire time through that season.

So what season are you in? Are you in a season where things don't make sense? Every season is beautiful in its own way. God has a plan and purpose for you, even if you can't see it. Pray about it, seek God!

## Weis/Wenger's Gift Cards


