### ARE YOU SERIOUS, JESUS? THE COST OF DISCIPLESHIP

We Lutherans are prolific in our talk of God's grace, mercy and forgiving love. We acknowledge that we are sinners and are in constant need of God's grace received in forgiveness with the promise of justification and salvation. Our life and destiny are clearly in God's hands; as stated by the Apostle Paul, "therefore by the grace of God go I." Our eternal relationship with God through Christ Jesus comes solely to us as gift.

So, what are we to make of Jesus' call to us to follow him on a path of demanding and obedient discipleship, especially in a time of a viral pandemic? The invitation and call to follow Jesus and his way of living is quite clear in its indication that Jesus is the Lord of our lives; that is, Jesus is the lead especially when our understanding of "normal" is upended. Expectations about and for the manner in which we live are to be drawn from the example of Jesus' own life, and not from our wants and desires or that which seeks to bring comfort and pleasure to ourselves, a return to "normal," so to speak.

God's grace brings us into the freedom to understand and walk within the gift of God's eternal acceptance of us in and through Christ. That is, God views us eternally not by the sum of our deeds and misdeeds but mercifully through the manner in which Christ lived, died and continues to live for and within us, a living presence that guides us even in times of uncertainty and through the challenging and often difficult choices to be made.

Grace is the path by which we are to see the future God holds in store for each and every one of us. But discipleship is the way we are to conduct our lives as we walk into the gift of God's eternity. With discipleship come demand and a call to obedience, to live under the Lordship of Christ Jesus and not those who would attempt to rule by fear and deceit, manipulation and opportunism. And the manner in which Jesus described these demands may seem unduly harsh

to our ears, especially for those of us who have grown quite comfortable and content with the notion of grace and "all is good."

Throughout the gospels we are reminded that Jesus connects discipleship with bearing one's cross, with loving one's enemies, with turning the other cheek, with going the extra mile, with opportunities to feed the hungry and care for the poor and all who could be referred to as "the least of these." More so, disciples are to act without false judgments and condemnation of others. In today's heightened rhetoric amidst much social unrest and division, the call to follow Jesus and to participate actively in the ministry and mission of the church can seem quite daunting. Where do we see ourselves in this picture?

Jesus' call to us to become his disciples is a call to continuously discern our priorities and preferences, particularly with regard to personal conduct and relational commitments. In essence, is our commitment to follow Jesus the primary directive and influence by the manner in which we engage life daily, individually and as the "body of Christ," the church?

Our eternal destiny is built upon the way Jesus lived and lives for us; our present walk through this life is to be built upon the manner in which we follow Jesus as Lord. Every decision and action bears a cost. Jesus himself bore the cost of all human sin upon the cross. To follow Jesus as Lord also bears a cost, a cost from God's side measured by grace but on our side measured by obedience and adherence to a life patterned after the way Jesus himself lived. In short, are we up to the task of discipleship, of following Jesus in difficult and challenging times, of bearing witness to God's grace, mercy and love, to be the examples of love over hate, unity over division, faith over fear, life over death?

# Dandelion Trail Run

Camp Mount Luther will be holding a 5- and 10- kilometer trail run race at the camp on **Saturday, September 5, 2020**. This is an entry-level trail race on Mount Luther grounds with proceeds going to the camp. The start time for the race is 9:00 a.m. Runners decide on race day if they want to do a 5k or 10K (a double loop of the 5K) run. The 10k distance is included in the Rocksylvania 10k race series. More details on that are available at <http://midpenntailblazers.com/links.html>. Race day registration is \$30.

Registration opens at 7:30 a.m. on race day. Spectators are welcome as well. A kid's fun run will also be held with two age categories: six and under and 7-10. Special awards will be presented to every participant in the fun run. Again, this year, a one-mile fun walk on a dirt road will be held with the same registration fees and amenities applying (or you may just walk without receiving amenities for \$10). Awards will be given for overall male and female race time, three

awards for each age group and an overall master's for male and female in both the 5K and the 10K. The awards ceremony will be immediately following the race. Shower facilities are available after the race. All miles for the course will be marked and there is one water stop on the course. Timing will be electronically done. The Dandelion Run, begun in 2002, is organized by Joel and Shelley Heasley of Middleburg. It was named in honor and memory of Rev. Glenn E. Heasley, Jr., former Assistant to the Bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Glenn's favorite "flower" was the dandelion.
